# "Socrates and the Modern Stage"

Based on a reading of Plato's dialogues as an unusual form of drama, I present playwrights who recognized in Plato the work of a dramatist and who followed him by writing plays based on the character Socrates. This tradition of what I call the Socrates Play becomes the point of departure for discussing the influence of Plato on modern drama more generally.

Martin Puchner is the author of Stage Fright: Modernism, Anti-Theatricality, and Drama (Hopkins, 2002), Poetry of the Revolution: Marx, Manifestos, and the Avant-Gardes (Princeton, 2006; winner of the MLA's James Russell Lowell Award) and The Drama of Ideas: Platonic Provocations in Theater and Philosophy (New York: Oxford University Press, 2010). He is the co-editor of Against Theatre: Creative Destructions on the Modernist Stage (Palgrave, 2006), The Norton Anthology of Drama (2009) and the new general editor of the Norton Anthology of World Literature, third edition (in preparation).
